

Notice of location of the claim Georgie by Frank S. Clark & George S. Garwood.
To whom it may concern.

Notice is hereby given that Frank S. Clark & George S. Garwood citizens of the United States of America over the age of twenty one years old, having complied with the requirements of chapter six of title thirty two of the revised statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws and regulations of miners, did, on the 20th day of October A. D. 1896 locate and by this notice do hereby locate a quartz claim known as the Georgie lode or mining claim, said claim having been discovered the 20th day of October 1896. and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on this lead lode or vein bearing mineral in place by 200 hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof together with all dips spurs and angles and all other veins of lodes the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries) twenty acres of said claim situated in Cedar Creek mining district County of Skamania State of Washington said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments and more particularly described as follows to-wit:

Commencing at discovery post running 300 feet in a northerly direction to northerly corner post thence 100 feet to north westerly cor. post thence thence 300 feet in a southerly direction to westerly end corner post thence 300 feet to the south westerly corner post thence 100 feet to the south easterly cor. post thence 300 feet to place of beginning at discovery post. This mining claim joins the Red Cliff mine on westerly end and we intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
