

NOTICE OF LOCATION OF QUARTZ CLAIM.EXTENSION OF THE CANYON CREEK LODGE.

Notice is hereby given that a citizen of the United States over the age of twenty one years has this 10th day of July 1883 discovered a vein or lode of quartz or sand rock bearing gold, silver and lead within the limits of the claim hereby located situated on Canyon Creek and in the County of Skamania and the Territory of Washington and known as an extension of the Canyon Creek Lode and has this 10th day of July 1883 under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length running to and from this notice at the prospect or discovery shaft the exterior boundaries of this claim being plainly marked by reference to natural objects and permanent monuments or more particularly described as follows, to wit: Beginning at a point in the center of the Lode at the prospect on the discovery shaft and running south easterly fifteen hundred feet in length with surface ground of three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said vein or lode including all dips, spurs and angles with the right to sufficient water from the Creek Crossing said vein or lode for working the same. NOTICE OF LOCATION OF QUARTZ CLAIM.
BED ROCK LODGE.

Notice is hereby given that a citizen of the United States over the age of twenty one years has this 10th day of July 1883, discovered a vein or lode of quartz or sand rock bearing gold, silver and lead within the limits of the claim hereby located situated on Canyon Creek about one fourth of a mile westerly from the Eagle vein or lode and in the County of Skamania and the Territory of Washington and known as the Bed Rock Lode and has this 10th day of July 1883 under and in accordance with the revised statutes of the United States located fifteen hundred linear feet of the vein or lode in length running to and from this notice at the prospect or discovery shaft the exterior boundaries of this claim being plainly marked by reference to natural objects and permanent, monuments or more particularly described as follows to wit: Beginning at a point in the center of the Lode at the prospect or discovery shaft and running north westerly fifteen hundred feet in length with surface ground of three feet in width on each side of the center of said vein or lode including all dips, spurs and angles with the right to sufficient water from the Creek crossing said vein or lode for working the same.
