

Notice of location of the claim - Kitty Clyde By Thos. H. Clark.

To whom it may concern

Notice is hereby given that T. H. Clark a citizen of the United States of America over the age of twenty one years old having complied with the requirements of chapter six of title thirty two of the revised Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did, on the 27th Day of October 1896 locate and by this notice do hereby locate a quartz claim known as the Kitty Clyde lode or mining claim, said claim having been discovered the 27th day of October 1896 and to claim fifteen hundred linear feet on this lode, lode or vein bearing mineral in place by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles and all other veins or lodes the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries (Twenty acres of said claim situated in Stevens County district County of Okanogan State of Washington, said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments and more particularly described as follows to-wit:

Commencing at the discovery post running 800 linear feet to southern westerly corner post thence 1000 linear feet to northwesterly corner post thence 800 linear feet northeasterly center post thence 800 linear feet to northeasterly corner post thence 1000 linear feet to southeasterly corner post thence 800 linear feet to place of beginning at discovery post.

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
