

Notice of location of the claim Stranger by Estella Cole
To whom it may concern

Notice is hereby given that I Estella Cole a citizen of the United States of America over the age of twenty one years, having complied with ~~all~~ the requirements of chapter six of title Thirty Two of the revised statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners did, on the 27th day of March A.D. 1897 locate and by this notice do hereby locate a quartz claim, said claim having been discovered the 27 day of March 1897, and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on this lead lode or vein bearing mineral in place by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof together with all dips, spurs and angles and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries) (twenty acres of mining ground, situated in the first creek north of Copper Creek Copper Creek Dis. County of Skamania State of Washington. Said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments and more particularly described as follows to wit: This claim runs 1500 feet in a northerly direction to N center stake then 300 feet in a westerly direction to N.W. corner stake then 1500 feet in a southerly direction to S.W. corner stake then 300 feet in a easterly direction along the Green Horn to S.E. corner stake then 1500 feet in a northerly direction to N.E. corner stake then 300 feet in a westerly direction to N. center stake. And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Wash.
