

Notice of location of the claim in Arlington by Louis Berry and John Ward.
To whom it may concern

Notice is hereby given that we the undersigned citizens of the United States of America, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six (6) Title Thirty two (32) of the revised statutes of the United States and all other mining laws, rules, customs and regulations did on February 26-1897 locate a gold and silver bearing quartz claim known as the Arlington situated in Skamania Co. Washington and on the south fork of Lewis river and on the south bank of said River about four miles above the mouth of Canyon creek. Described as follows beginning at a tree on corner of said ledge thence running down the river in a westerly direction 100 feet to a post thence in a southerly direction 100 feet to a post thence east 400 feet to a post thence north 100 feet to a post thence west 300 feet to place of beginning.
