

notice of location of the claim: Lost mine by W.F. Berry & Wm. Hyman.
To whom it may concern:

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned citizen of the United States, having complied with all the requirements of Chapter 84 of title thirty two of the revised statutes of the United States, and the local mining laws, rules and regulations, has located 1500 linear feet on this lode or vein, situated in the Copper Creek mining district, Blaine County, Wash. and described as follows.

Beginning at this notice on alder tree (about 12 in dia.) at mouth of old tunnel, on N. bank of east fork of Lewis river & running S.W. for 300 ft to hemlock tree marked S.W. corner of "Lost mine"; thence 1500 ft N.W. to stake marked N.W. corner of "Lost mine"; thence 300 ft N.E. to stake marked N. end of "Lost mine"; continuing 300 to stake marked N. corner of "Lost mine"; thence 1500 ft S.E. to hemlock tree (8 in diameter) marked S.E. cor. of "Lost mine"; thence 300 ft S.W. to place of beginning.

This claim is known as the "Lost mine" claim, is situated on the N. bank of E. fork of Lewis River, about 800 ft W. of the "Greenhorn claim". The "Good Hope" lies south of this claim.
