

Notice of location of the claim Golden Star by W.M. Stalmaker & C.
To whom it may concern

Notice is hereby given that W.M. Stalmaker and C. Stalmaker
citizens of the United States of America, over the age of twenty one
years, having complied with the requirements of chapter six
of title thirty two of the revised statutes of the United States and
all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington and
the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did, on
the 26th day of February A.D. 1897, locate and by this notice do
hereby locate a quartz claim, known as the Golden Star lode
or mining claim, said claim having been discovered the 21 day
of February 1897, and do claim fifteen hundred feet on this lead, lode
or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the
same being three hundred feet on each side of the centre thereof
together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes
the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries. Situated in Lewis
River district county of Skamania State of Washington said location
being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects
or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as
follows to wit:

Beginning at the south center stake of the Fortune mining claim
no 1 and running thence 300 ft 85° S. W. to the S. W. corner of aforesaid
claim thence 1500 feet S. E. 8° to a fir stake thence 300 ft N.E.
 85° to a maple stake thence 1500 ft N.W. 5° to a fir stake at
the S. E. corner of the Fortune claim no 1 thence 300 ft 85° S. W.
to point of beginning.

and we intend to hold and work said claim in accordance
with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws
of the United States and of the state of Washington.
