

Notice of Relocation of "Bulger Lode" by J. K. Manning
To whom it may concern;

Notice is hereby given, That J. K. Manning citizen of the United States of America over the age of twenty one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington, and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did on the 11th day of May AD 1897 locate, and by this notice do hereby relocate a Lode Claim known as the Bulger Lode or mine, claim, said claim having been discovered the 11th day of May 1897, and do claim (fifteen hundred feet on this lead lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins of lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries) twenty acres of mining ground, situated in Copper Creek Mining District, County of Skamania State of Washington said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Notice is on a large timber near an old abandoned tunnel on Chocoma Creek about 600 feet west of the Notice there is a tributary from the east side of Bell Mountain that empties into said Chocoma Creek, beginning at the stake and line I do claim 100 feet on the center of this lead lode or vein running in a North by West direction and 300 feet East by and 300 feet West by from the center thereof The discovery is about 75 feet west of this Notice in Chocoma Creek, The Center ends and corner stakes are all established. This claim was located on the 11th day of October 1896 by Charles H. Mendenhall and W. C. Safford and recorded in Book "C" page 252, of Miscellaneous Mining Claims of Skamania Co. See also recorded on page 18 of Book "C" of Deeds of Skamania County, Wash.

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners, and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington
