THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, TO ALL TO WHOM

THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington, has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress of May 20, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto the claim of Philip C. Buslach, has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the south half of the north-east quarter and the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of section five in Township one north of range five east of the Willamette Meridian, Washington, containing one hundred twenty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor-General:

NOW, KNOW YE, that there is, therefore granted by the United States unto the said claimant the tract of land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land, with the appurtenances, thereof, unto the said claimant and to the heirs and assigns of the said claimant forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.
