

Notice of Location of Legal Tender Lode by D.W. Ward
To whom it may concern:

Notice is hereby given, That D.W. Ward, citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the Stat of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of business did, on the 8th day of May A.D. 1897, locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a Quartz Claim, known as the Legal Tender Lode or Mining Claim, said claim having been discovered the 8th day of May 1897, and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on the lead, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries) (twenty acres of mining ground,) situated in Copper Creek Mining District, County of Skamania State of Washington, said location being described as & distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Commencing at the Notice on the North side of same which lies over the Lawrence M. Notice is on at Summit Springs It runs 1000 feet in a Northerly direction on the center of the lode, lead or vein as shown by the outcroppings and 300 feet Easterly and 300 Westerly from the center thereof. The center line is blazed through from the Notice and discovery to the North center end stake. The end lines are blazed and the four corners established. The South end of this claim joins the Lawrence M. claim on the North end.

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the Mining Laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
