

Notice of Location of St George Mine G. A. Manning To whom it may concern

Notice is hereby given, That G. A. Manning, citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statute of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did on the 14th day of May A.D. 1897, locate, and by this Notice do hereby locate a Lode Claim, known as the St George Lode or Mining Claim, said claim having been discovered the 14th day of May 1897, and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on this lead, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries) (being a part of mining ground), situated in Copper Creek District, County of Skamania, State of Washington, said location being described and distinctly marked by surveyors & natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the large tree and Notice it runs 500 feet in a Southwesterly direction from the center of the Lewis River on the center of the lead, lode or vein and 500 feet Easterly, and 500 feet Westerly from the center thereof as shown by the out-croppings. The discovery is in the South Bank of the Lewis River 50 feet from the notice. This claim is on the east side of deep canyon that runs North Westerly and the South end of this claim joins the St Mary claim. The center and End lines are flagged and the four corners established. And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
