

Notice of Location of Shamrock by Joseph M. Manning  
To witness, it may concern,

Notice is hereby given, that Joseph M. Manning, citizen  
of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one  
years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six  
of Title Thirty, Laws of the United States of the State of Washington  
and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of  
Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations  
of miners did on the 12th day of May AD 1897, locate, and  
by this Notice do hereby locate a new Mining Claim known as the  
Shamrock Lode or Mining Claim, said claim having been  
discovered on 12th day of May 1897, and do claim fifteen hun-  
dred feet on the head, lode or vein bearing mineral in  
place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three  
hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all  
deeps, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex  
of which lie within said bounds (a) (Twenty acres of mining  
ground), situated in Copper Creek Mining District, County  
of Skamania. It is of Washington, said location being described  
and distinctly marked by signs due to natural objects or per-  
manent monuments, and more particularly described as follows  
to wit:

Commencing at this large tree and noted, I do claim 1500  
feet running in a Northwesterly direction on the center of this  
head, lode or vein and 800 feet Eastward, and 300 feet Westward,  
from the center line as shown by the outcroppings.  
The discovery shaft is at the south end near the Notice, The  
North end of this claim joins the South end of the Shamrock  
Claim, The center line and end lines are flagged out and  
the four corners established.

I do intend to hold and work said claim in accordance  
with the local customs and rules of miners, and the mining  
laws of the United States and of the State of Washington
