

Notice of Location of St. Vincent by V. A. Manning
To whom it may concern

Notice is hereby given, That V. A. Manning, citizen of the United States of America, now the age of twenty one years having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty, laws of the Revised Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the Stat of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did, on the 12th day of May A.D. 1897, locate, and by this Notice do hereby locate a Lode Claim, known as the St. Vincent Lode or Mining Claim, said claim having been discovered the 12th day of May 1897, and its claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on this lead, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries) situated in Copper Creek Mining District, County of Skamania State of Washington, said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Commencing at this large fir tree and Notice, I do claim 1000 feet in a Southwesterly direction on the center of the lead, lode or vein and 300 feet Easterly, and 300 feet Westerly from the center thereof of as shown by the outcroppings of the discovery shafts near the Notice on the summit in the dead timber at the center and strike. The north end of this claim joins the South end of the Shamrock claim. The corners are established, and I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
