UNITED STATES TO TICKNER.

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA TO ALL TO WHOM

THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

Certificate No. 7507.

WHEREAS, IRVING L. TICKNER has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington, whereby it appears that fully payment has been made by the said Irving L. Tickner according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the southeast quarter of section nine in Township three north of Range seven east of the Willamette Meridian, Washington, containing one hundred sixty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Irving L. Tickner: NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Irving L. Tickner his heirs, the said tract above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Irving L. Tickner, and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein of lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises

hereby granted, as provided by law; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

In testimony whereof I, Theodore Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, chapter Six, Title Thirty^{two}, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and field Notes of survey and the Certificate, No. 01526, of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, in the State of Washington, accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that the Cascadia Mining and Development Company, did on the fifth day of March A.D. 1908, duly enter and pay for that certain mining claim or premises, known as the Black Falls No. 1 Polar Star No. 2, Polar Star No. 3, Polar Star Junior No. 3, Polar Star Junior No. 1, Phil Sheridan No. 2, Black Hawk, Polar Star No. 1, Black Falls No. 2, Phil Sheridan No. 1, and Polar Star Junior No. 2, lode mining claims, designated by the Surveyor General as survey No. 689 A, embracing a portion of section thirteen in Township ten north of range five east and Sections seven and eighteen in township ten north of Range six east of the Willamette Meridian, in the St. Helens, unorganized, Mining District, in the County of Skamania, and State of Washington, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Vancouver and bounded described, and platted as follows, with magnetic variation as hereinafter stated: Beginning for the description of the Black Falls No. 1 lode claim, at corner No. 1, a fir post four and onehalf feet long, four inches square, marked 1-689 A and 1 689 A. with mound of earth, from which the quarter corner to Sections seven and eighteen
