

Notice of Location of "Helena Claim" by Adolph Chamberlain

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given, That Adolph Chamberlain, a Citizen of the United States of America, over the age of 21 years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter 219, of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the Stat. of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of Miners, did, on the 16th day of November, A.D. 1896, locate and by this notice do hereby locate a lode claim known as the "Helena" lode or mining claim, said claim having been discovered the 16th day of November, A.D. 1896, and does claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on this lode, and or over bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center line) together with all dip, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries (twenty acres of mining ground), situated in Stearns County, Mining District, County of Skamania, State of Washington, said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a post set at point of discovery in center of claim, running thence 700 ft. in easterly direction to East corner stake, thence 300 ft. to South East corner stake, thence 1000 ft. to South West corner stake, thence 300 ft. to West corner stake, thence 300 ft. to North West corner stake, thence 1000 ft. to North East corner stake, thence 300 ft. to East corner stake, (and I intend to locate and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.)
