

Notice of Location of Elkhorn Claim by J. P. Anderson
 To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby
 Given, That J. P. Anderson a citizen of the United States
 of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having com-
 plied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title thirty
 two of the Revised Statute of the United States and of all other
 mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington and the
 local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did, on
 the first day of May A.D. 1897, locate, and by this notice do
 hereby locate a Lode Claim, known as the Elkhorn Lode
 or mining claim, said claim having been discovered the
 first day of May 1897, and do claim (fifteen hundred linear
 feet on the lead, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six
 hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each
 side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and
 all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said
 boundaries) (twenty acres of placer mining ground), situated
 in Cooper Creek dist county of Skamania State of Washington said
 location being described and distinctly marked by reference to
 natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly
 described as follows, to wit:

Commencing at the center of Canyon Creek fifteen
 hundred feet about 5 degrees East of South, commencing at
 this notice running these hundred feet west to a tree marked
 N.W. corner thence South 1500 feet to a tree marked S.W.
 corner thence East three hundred feet to a tree marked
 South end center, thence three hundred feet East to a stake
 in a "rock pit" marked S.E. corner stake thence 1000
 feet to N.E. corner thence three hundred feet West to
 place of beginning. This claim is known as the Elkhorn

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance
 with the local customs and rules of miners and the Mining
 laws of the United States and of the State of Washington
