

Notice of location of Solomon Claim by Henry Thiesen
 Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen
 of the United States, over the age of twenty one years, on the
 1 day of June 1897. Relocated a vein or lode of lode or sand
 rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits
 of the claim hereby located, and have this 1 day of June
 1897, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes
 of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet on this
 vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred
 feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in
 the Ball Mountain Mining District, County of Stannan and
 State of Washington and known as the Solomon Mining Claim, and
 extending fifteen hundred feet to and from the notice at the dis-
 covery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim
 being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or per-
 manent monuments, and more particularly described as follows,
 to-wit: Thence running (200) three hundred ft
 in a North Easterly direction, Thence fifteen hundred ft (1500)
 in a North Westerly direction to North West corner Thence South
 Westerly direction (200) three hundred ft to center
 end stake, Thence (200) three hundred ft in the same direction
 to corner stake Thence (1000) hundred ft in a South Easterly
 direction to corner stake Thence (200) three hundred ft in
 a North Easterly direction to place of beginning. This claim
 is located on Blue Bird creek and Put-I island to hold
 and mark said above described claim as provided by
 the local laws, and the customs and rules of miners, and
 mining statistics and laws of the United States.
