

Notice of Location of Lumber Claim Columbia by John Dassel
 Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a
 citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty one years
 on the 23 day of May 1896, discovered some or lode of
 Lumber or sand rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead,
 within the limits of the claim hereby located, and have this
 23 day of May 1896, under and in accordance with the
 Revised Statute of the United States, located fifteen hundred lin-
 ear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground
 three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of
 said lode, situated in the said Mountain Mining District,
 County of Kamania and State of Washington and known as
 the Columbia Mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred
 feet to and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft.
 The exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked
 by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and
 more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

This claim runs 1400 feet from point of discovery on
 a Easterly direction and 100 feet in a Westerly direction from
 point of discovery by three hundred feet on each side from
 center line of said lode discovery is by an uprooted tree
 on the main trail and said claim is nearest to the last
 chance mining claim situated on the East Fork of the
 North Fork of the Washington River and that we intend
 to locate and work said above described claim as provided
 by the local laws, and the customs and rules of miners, and
 mining statutes and laws of the United States, Discovered on
 the ground the 23 of May 1896, Located the 25th of May 1896
