

Location Notice of "South Chicago Lode" by W. E. T. Mattachas

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that I, W. E. T. Mattachas, Vancouver, Clarke County Washington, a citizen of the United State of America, conforming to the mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington, and the local rules, regulations and customs of miners, has located and by this notice do locate claim known as the South Chicago Lode or Mining Claim, said claim being discovered the Second day of June 1897 and do claim fifteen hundred linear feet on this lode, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries, situated in the Crespus & St. Helens Mining District County of Skamania State of Washington, said location being described and marked on the ground as follows To-wit:

Discovery is situated North Slope what is known as the Prosser Range of Mountain about 1/4 mile South of the Chicago discovery and about 1 1/4 mile South-west of Mount Piemont near the head of North Fork of Toutle River, Crespus & St. Helens Mining District Wash. said claim running from discovery in a Northwesterly Direction.

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of Miners and the Mining Laws of the United State and of the State of Washington, Dated on Ground the Second day of June 1897 Discovered Second June 1897 Located June 2nd 1897.
