

Notice of Location of Luster Claim "Mabel Edith" by J. M. Fike
 Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a
 Citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the
 1st day of June 1897, discovered a vein or lode of Luster or sand
 rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits
 of the claim hereby located, and gave this notice on the 1st day of June 1897.
 Under and in accordance with the Revised Statute of the
 United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein
 or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet
 in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in
 the Gold Mountain Mining District, County of Klamath and
 State of Washington, and known as the Mabel Edith Mining
 Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice
 at the discovery or prospect-shaft; the exterior boundaries of this
 claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects
 or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as
 follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the Notice or Prospect Shaft, running 300 feet
 in a South-Westerly direction to the center post, thence 1000 feet in
 a North-Westerly direction to the corner post, thence 300 feet in a North
 Easterly direction to the center end stake, thence 300 feet in the same
 direction to the corner post, thence 1000 feet in a South Easterly
 direction to the corner post, thence 300 feet in a South Westerly
 direction to the place of beginning, this place holds all dips, spurs
 and angles and valuable deposits within the boundaries, located
 on Shagan Creek, a tributary of the Washougal river
 and that I intend to hold and work said above described
 claim as provided by the local laws and the customs and
 rules of miners and mining Statutes and laws of the United
 States, Discovered on the ground June 1st, 1897
