

Notice of Location of Lundy Claim Magahilda by P. Hesselberg
 Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen
 of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the
 first day of July 1897, discovered a vein or lode of Lundy or
 sand rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the
 limits of the claim hereby located and have this 3rd day of
 July 1897, under and in accordance with the Revised
 Statute of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet
 of this vein or lode in length, with 200 feet of surface ground, three
 hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said
 lode. Situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District County of
 Shasmanian and State of Washington and known as the Magahilda
 Mining claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from
 the notice at the discovery or prospect shaft. The exterior bound-
 aries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to
 natural objects or permanent monuments, and more par-
 ticularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at prospect running North East, 300 ft. to
 North East corner post, thence 1500 ft. South East, to South East
 corner post, thence 300 ft. South West, to center end post,
 thence 300 ft. same course to South West corner post, thence
 1500 ft. North West, to North West corner post, thence 300 ft.
 North East, to place of beginning. The above described claim
 is situated on a tributary of Blue Bird Creek about 100 ft. above
 a fall, and about 300 ft. South West from Blue Bird Creek.
 The adjoining claim is the Shasmanian on the North and that
 I intend to hold and work said above described claim
 as provided by the local laws, and the customs and rules
 of miners, and mining statute and laws of the United
