

Notice of Location, Lauretta Claim by Nellie Manning

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given, That Nellie Manning citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title thirty-two of the Revised Statute of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and by the state of Washington and the local customs, rules and regulations of miners, did, on the 24th day of June A.D. 1897, locate, and by this notice also hereby locate a Lode Claim, known as the Lauretta Lode or mining Claim, said claim having been discovered the 24th day of June 1897, and do claim (feet in hundred lines) feet on this lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries (Twenty-acres of mining ground), situated in Copper Creek Mining District County of Deane State of Washington, said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows to-wit: Beginning at a point in the center of Copper Creek 50 feet East of the North East corner of the Belia Claim & run 1400 feet more or less in a southerly direction to the center end stake thence westerly along the line of the Belia Claim to corner stake, thence northerly along the end line of the Belia claim to center of Copper Creek thence easterly, 300 feet more or less to the north west corner of the Genovian claim thence southerly along the West line of the Genovian claim to the north east corner of the Leo B. Claim thence westerly to center end stake and notice and discovery. This is a fractional claim less than 500 feet wide at north end and less than 1400 feet from north end line to south center end stake. And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of
