WHEREAS, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter six, Title thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and Field notes of survey and the Certificate No. 10 of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver in the State of Washington accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears

that the Cascadia Mining and Development Company, did, on the nineteenth day of January, A.D. 1906, duly enter and pay for that certain mining claim or premises, known as the Minnie Lee No. 1 Minnie Lee No. 2, Minnie Lee No. 3, N.C. No. 2 and N.C. No. 1 lode mining, and Minnie Lee No. 1 and Minnie Lee No. 2 millsite claims designated by the surveyor General as Lots No. 0697 A and 697 B respectively, embracing a portion of the unsurveyed public domain, in the St. Helens Mining District in the County of Skamania, and State of Washington, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Vancouver and bounded, described, and platted as follows, with magnetic variation as hereinafter stated.

Third. That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature at Washington may provide rules for working the mining claim or premises hereby granted, involving easements, drainage, and other necessary means to its complete development.
