Notice is hereby given, that Thomas Ryan of Cleavenon,  
Skamania County, Washington, claims a lien upon a certain  
lot of fir saw logs, being about 200,000 feet in quantity,  
which were cut in Skamania County, Washington, and are

coupling dogs; 2 blocks; 125 feet cable; 5 cross cut saws, 1 falling  
saw; 6 wedges; 5 sledges; 18 shovels; 116 feet hemlock rope; 1 grind  
stone; 2 push blocks; 2 pick axes; 10 grub hoes; 1 foot adz; 2 chains  
9 pennys; 18 axes; 1 box stone; 12 saw handles; 1 pair skidding tongs;  
100 lbs Blacksmith coal; 1 cooking range; furniture and utensils, and  
all other personal property said company used in the operation  
of its business in said county and state. All of said property  
situate in said company's logging camp near Cleavenon, Wash-  
ington; also on franchises, earnings, contracts and the logging road.

used in the operation of its business; also upon all real estate owned by said company in said county and state, said real estate being the north half of the D. L. C of Henry Shephard and wife as described in book "F" pages 272 to 276 record of mortgages of said county and state, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in manufacturing said logs and the construction of said logging road and logging plank of said company; That the name of the owner or reputed owner is the said J. N. Russell, B. J. Russell, W. J. Smith and J. H. Parelius, doing business under the firm name of Russell, Smith & Co.; That Robert Manary foreman and agent of said Russell Smith & Co. employed said Thomas Ryan to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to wit: at the rate of \$1<sup>25</sup> per day for 33 days and 48<sup>1/4</sup> days at \$2.25 per day. The said Russell Smith, & Co. by their foreman and agent Robert Manary agreed to pay the said Thomas Ryan for such labor and assistance as hereinbefore set forth; That said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said Thomas Ryan who performed labor upon and assisted in manufacturing said saw logs and in building and operating said log-way and logging plank for the period of 33 days at \$1<sup>25</sup> per day and 48<sup>1/4</sup> days at \$2<sup>25</sup> per day that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said logs and upon said logging way and upon said logging plank between the 7<sup>th</sup> day of April 1899 and the 25<sup>th</sup> day of July 1899 and the rendition of said service was closed on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of July 1899; and Thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimants demand for said service is \$168<sup>75</sup> Dollars; That no part thereof has been paid except \$107<sup>80</sup> Dollars and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credit and offsets the sum of \$60<sup>92</sup> Dollars, in which amounts he claims a lien upon said logs and upon said personal property and said real property hereinbefore described. The said Thomas Ryan also claims a lien upon all said logs, franchise earnings, contracts logging road and all personal property and real property now owned by said J. N. Russell, B. J. Russell, W. J. Smith and J. H. Parelius as partners under the firm name of Russell, Smith & Co. in said state.


