

Notice of Location of O'Brien Lode By Albert & Frank O'Brien

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that Albert O'Brien and Frank O'Brien citizens of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States, and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did on the 26th day of August A.D. 1897, locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a Lode, known as the O'Brien Lode or Mining Claim, said claim having been discovered the 15th day of July 1897, and do claim (fifty) hundred linear feet on this lode, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins at lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries (thirty acres of mining ground) (Twenty acres of mining ground), situated in Copper Creek Mining District County of Skamania State of Washington said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point about 200 feet from Copper Creek and the South East corner Stake of the Big Elephant Claim. Thence 1000 feet in a North easterly direction to center end Stake Thence 200 feet in a westerly direction to the North West corner Stake Thence 1000 feet in a southerly direction to the East line of the Big Elephant Claim Thence 200 feet in a easterly direction along the East line of the Big Elephant Claim to the center end Stake Thence 200 feet along the South East corner Stake of this claim & the Big Elephant claim. Thence 1000 feet North easterly, to the North East corner stake Thence 200 feet westerly, to the center end Stake. The Discovery is in small tributary to Copper Creek about 200 feet from South center end Stake on the center line. This is an extension of the Big Elephant Lode or Vein.
