

"Golden Light" claim

Notice of Location of "Wild Bay" by G. W. Lawton
 Notice is hereby given, to Whome it may
 Concern: That Geo. W. Lawton, citizen of the
 United States, over the age of Majority—Over years,
 having discovered a vein or ledge of quartz or
 other rock in place, bearing gold, silver, copper,
 or other valuable mineral deposit within the
 limits of the claim hereby located, have this
 day under and in accordance with the statutes
 of the United States and of the State of Wash-
 ington and the customs, regulations and laws
 in force at the date of this location, located
 Fifteen Hundred (1500) feet in length along said
 vein or lode, ~~at the surface~~ and Three Hundred
 (300) feet wide on each side of the middle of said
 vein or lode, at the surface, situated in "Wild
 Bay" mining district, County of Skamania,
 State Washington, and known as the "Gol-
