

Notice of Location of Luster Claim Mark by W. D. Scott

Notice is hereby given, That the undersigned citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 4 day of September 1897, discovered a vein or lode of Luster or Sand Rock in place, bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby located and have this 14 day of September 1897, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length with surface ground, three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Copper Creek Mining District, County of Skamania and State of Washington and known as the Luster Mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice: the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural or artificial or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at location notice and running in a Westerly direction 300 ft. to center side stake thence 700 ft. in a Northerly direction to North West Corner Stake thence 600 ft. in an Easterly direction to North East Corner Stake, and thence 700 ft. South East to Center Side Stake and thence 700 ft. in a Southerly direction to South East corner Stake thence 600 ft. in a Westerly direction to South West Corner Stake, thence 700 ft. in a Northerly direction to Center Side Stake, all situated on the East side of the head of Texas Gulch and that I intend to hold and mark said above described claim as provided by the local laws and customs and rules of miners and mining statutes and laws of the United States.
