

Notice of Location of Lode Claim Little Sioux by Geo A Rogers

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, who is a citizen of the United States, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and the local customs, laws and regulations, has this day located and claimed 1500 linear feet along the course of this lead, lode or vein of mineral bearing quartz, and 200 feet in width on each side of said lead, lode or vein, together with all mineral deposits contained therein and all claims governing within the limits of said claim and all water and water privileges thereon or appurtenant thereto, situated in St Helens Mining District Stannum County, State of Washington, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the North end of the Jewett Lode claim and runs from thence fifteen hundred feet in a southerly course along the lead, lode or vein, together with three hundred feet in width on each side of the middle of said lead, lode or vein. This claim extends 432 feet southerly from location notice, and 1068 feet southerly from location notice. This claim is situated on a small stream flowing into the North Fork of the Toulle River, about one mile from the source of said river, and shall be known as the Little Sioux Mine.
