

Henry Holmes vs Russell, Smith & Co.

Whereas it is hereby given, that Henry Holmes, of Stevenson, Okla-
man County, Washington, claims a lien upon a certain lot of
fir saw logs, being about 200,000 feet in quantity, which were
cut in Okman County, Washington, and are marked thus:
Not charred, and are now lying in the woods on John Wacker's
place more particularly described as follows, to-wit: S.W. 1/4 of
S.E. 1/4 E. 1/2 of S.W. 1/4 S.W. 1/4 of S.W. 1/4 Sec. 25 T. 3 S. R. 7 E. N. 1/4, in
Okman County, Washington, also upon all logs lying on
bank of Slough and in Slough upon north half of the Henry Shep-
ard and wife S. L. C. Said land being more particularly des-
cribed in book F on pages 272-276, record of mortgages of Ok-
man County, Washington, also upon all logs on bank and
in boom on south half of said Henry Shepard and wife
S. L. C. in said county and state, and said above named
claimant also claims a lien upon eleven head of horses brand-
ed and described as follows: 1 bay horse branded F on
right shoulder; 1 bay horse branded A on left shoulder; 1 grey
horse branded in district; 1 bay horse, no brand; 1 roan
horse branded on right shoulder V; 1 white mare, 1 grey mare,
1 grey horse, 1 white horse, 1 bay horse, 1 brown horse - brands unknown.
All of said horses being in possession of Thomas Ryan in Ok-
man County, Washington. 5 sets of harness; 1 saddle; 1 black-
smith outfit; 4 barrels skid oil; 2 kegs horse shoes; 6 pair spreaders;
3 3/4 pair coupling dogs; 2 blocks; 125 feet cable; 5 cross cut saws, 1 fa-
mily saw; 6 wedges; 5 sledges; 18 shovels; 116 feet 1 1/2 inch rope; 1 grind stone
2 push blocks; 3 pick axes; 10 grub hoes; 1 foot adz; 2 chains; 9 pair
legs; 18 axes; 1 box stove; 12 saw handles; 1 pair skidding tong; 100 lbs
blacksmith coal; 1 cooking range; furniture and utensils, and
all other personal property said company used in the operation of
its business in said county and state. All of said property
situate in said company's logging camp near Stevenson, Wash-
ington; also on franchise, earnings, contracts and the logging road
used in the operation of its business; also upon all real estate
owned by said company in said county and state, said

real estate being the north half of the S.E. C of Henry Shepard and wife as described in book "F" pages 272 & 276 record of mortgages of said county and state, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in manufacturing said logs and the construction of said logging road and logging plant of said company; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is the said J. N. Russell, B. J. Russell, W. J. Smith and J. H. Parelius, doing business under the firm name of Russell, Smith & Co.; that Robert Manary, foreman and agent of said Russell, Smith & Co., employed said Henry Holmes to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit: at the rate of \$2.⁵⁰ per day for all labor performed, that said Russell, Smith & Co., by their foreman and agent, Robert Manary, agreed to pay the said Henry Holmes for such labor and assistance as hereinbefore set forth, that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said Henry Holmes who performed labor upon and assisted in manufacturing said saw logs and in building and operating said log-way and logging plant for the period of 114 days; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said logs and upon said logging plant between the 1st day of June 1899, and the 15th day of July, 1899, and the rendition of said services was closed on the 15th day of July, 1899, and 30 days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said services is \$34.72 dollars, that no part thereof has been paid, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets the sum of Thirty Four 72/100 dollars, in which amount he claims a lien upon said logs and upon said personal property and said real property hereinbefore described; that said Henry Holmes also claims a lien upon all said logs, franchises, earnings, contracts, logging road and all personal property and upon all real property now owned by said J. N. Russell, B. J. Russell, W. J. Smith and J. H. Parelius as partners under the firm name of Russell, Smith & Co. in said Skamania County, Washington, to secure payment for the work and labor performed as herein described.
