

Location of the "Yellow Bird" Mine Notice of Location

To whom it may concern

Notice is hereby given that C. Cole a citizen of the United States of America over the age of twenty one years having complied with the requirement of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statute of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof and of the State of Wash and the local customs laws rules and regulations of miners did on the 18th day of Sept A.D. 1896 locate and by this notice do hereby locate a Lumpy claim known as the Yellow Bird lode or mining claim said claim having been discovered the 18th day of Sept 1896 and do claim fifteen hundred linear feet on this lead lode or vein bearing mineral in place by six hundred feet in width the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof with all dips spurs and angle and all other veins or lodes the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries situated in Copper Creek County of Klamath State of Wash said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

This claim runs the Big Elephant on the N and the north line is on a line with the claim known as the Big Elephant there is an old ruined Cabin opposite the south end and it is on the south side of the Creek known as Copper Creek the Center notice on the south end is on an hemlock tree this claim runs 500 feet north by 10 degrees West from where the notice is posted and 300 feet each way from center

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington
