

Notice of Location of Emma mine by E. H. Lang, Roy Sibley & H. B. Rankin

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned are citizens of the United States and over twenty one years. Having complied with Chapter six of Title Thirty-two of the revised Statutes of the United States and local laws and Customs of the State of Washington.

Have this day located thirty first of July 1897 located fifteen hundred linear feet along the mineral bearing lode, ledge or deposit by three hundred feet on each side of center of said ledge with all its dips, spurs and angles containing gold, silver, copper, iron or tin, or any other precious metals that may be discovered within said boundaries of said Claim known as the Emma mine No 4 and described as follows.

Said claim is situated on a tide island of the Lewis River and in Skamania County State of Washington about six miles in a north westerly direction from Mt. Adams forming the E. W. S. on the south and the E. W. S. on the East and the boundary lines commencing at this discovery stake and running three hundred feet northerly to the North west corner stake, thence fifteen hundred feet easterly to the North east corner stake, thence three hundred feet southerly to the east end center stake, thence three hundred feet southerly to the south east corner stake, thence fifteen hundred feet westerly to the south west corner stake, thence three hundred feet northerly to the west end center stake or place of beginning.
