Notice of Location

To whom it may concern

Notice is hereby given that W. E. Satterfield a citizen of the United States of America over the age of twenty one years having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statute of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof and of the State of Wash and the local customs laws and regulations of miners did on the 17th day of Aug A.D. 1896 locate and by this notice do hereby locate a quartz claim known as the Ida Martin Lode or Mining claim said claim having been discovered the 17th day of Aug 1896 and do claim (fifty hundred linear feet in this lead lode or vein bearing mineral in place by six hundred feet in width the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof together with all dips spurs and angles and all other veins or lodes the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries) situated in Copper Creek Dist County of Skamania State of Wash said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural object or permanent monuments and more particularly described as follows to wit: -

Laying on Copper Creek the center of the claim is fifty feet East of the South West Corner of the claim known as the Big Elephant and 200 feet West of the Center of the Big Elephant or west of the spring branch falls close by the center of the Big Elephant the northeast corner is 50 feet East of the spring branch falls from these points running N 80° East or south by 10 degrees East and 300 feet each way from center.

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the Mining Laws of the United States and of the State of Washington
