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From F. G. Iman & Wife to Simeon Geil.

This Indenture, made the Sixteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord, one Thousand, Eight Hundred and Thirty seven, between Felix G. Iman, and Margarette Iman, his wife of the County of Skamania in the Territory of Washington, the parties of the first part and Simeon Geil, of the same County and Territory of the Second part: Witnesseth:

That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration, of the sum of One Thousand, \$1000. Dollars Gold Coin of the United States of America, to them in hand paid do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part and to his heirs and assigns forever, all that certain tracts, pieces or parcels of land lying and being in the County and Territory aforesaid, and being more particularly described as follows.

Being the North East quarter of the North West quarter and lots number six (6) Seven (7) and Nine (9) in Section number One in Township number Two (2) North of Range Number Seven (7) East of the Willamette Meridian, Containing Eighty-six (86) 1/100 Acres: And the North Half of the Donation Land Claim, of the parties of the first part, Number Forty Four (44) being part of Sections, Number, Two (2) and eleven (11), in Township, Number Two (2) North of Range Number Seven (7) East of the Willamette Meridian Containing, Three Hundred and Twenty Three 24/100 (323, 24/100) Acres, and also the North half of the Donation Land Claim of Daniel Baughman Number Forty-Two (42) being parts of Section Numbers One (1) Two (2) and eleven (11) in Township Number Two (2) North of Range Number Seven (7) East of the Willamette Meridian containing, One Hundred and Sixty (160) Acres more or less.

Together with all and singular, the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances, thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining. This conveyance is intended as a Mortgage to secure the payment of a certain promissory note, which are hereto and figures as follows, to-wit: Cascades Clarke County, W.T. October 16th 1867. Three years after date for value received, we jointly and severally promise to pay to Simeon Geil or Order the sum of One Thousand in Gold Coin, with interest till paid.

And these presents shall be void if such payment is made, but in case of default be made in the payment of the principal, or interest, as in said promissory note is provided then the said party of the second part, his executors, administrators and assigns, are hereby empowered to sell the said premises with all and every part of the appurtenances, or any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law, and out of the money arising from such sale to retain the said principal and interest, together with the costs and charges of making such sale; and the overplus, if any there be, shall be paid by the party making such sale on demand, to the said parties of the first part, their heirs, or assigns.
