NOW, KNOW YET, that there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said claimant, the tract of land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof unto the said claimant and to the heirs and assigns of the said claimant forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be resognized and acknowledged by the boal custons, laws, and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME GREETING:

WHEREAS, by the act of Congress approved July 2,1864, (13 Stat., 365) entitled "An act granting lands to aid in the construction of a Railrand and Telegraph line from Lake Supersorto Puget's Sound, on the Pacific Coast, by the Northern Route, "and the joint Resolution of May 31, 1870 (16 Stat., 378) there was granted to the Northern Pacific Railroad Company, its successors and assigns, forthe purpose of aiding in the construction of said railroad and telegraph line, and branch, to the Pacific Coast, "every alternate section of public land, not mineral, designated by odd numbers, to the amount of twenty alternate sections per mile on each side of said railroad line, as said company may adopt, throughtthe territories of the United States, and ten alternate sections of land per mile on each side of said railroad whenever it passes through any state, and whenever on the line thereof the United States have full title, not reserved, sold, granted, or otherwise appropriated, and free from pre-emption or other claims or rights, at the time the line of said road is definitely fixed, and a plat thereof filed in the office of the

Commissioner of the General Land Office"; and

WHEREAS, it is furtherprovided that "whenever, prior to said time, any of said sections or parts of sections shall have been granted, sold, reserved, occupied by homestead settlers, or pre-empted, or otherwise disposed of, other lands shall be selected by said company in lieu thereof, under the direction of the Secretary of the Interior, in alternate sections and designated by odd numbers, not more than ten miles beyond the limits of said alternate sections: Provided, further, "That all mineral lands be, and the same are hereby, excluded from the operations of this act," and provided further "That the word 'Mineral' when it occurs in this act, shall not be held to include iron or coal;"

WHEREAS, official statements from the Secretary of the Interior have been filed in the General Land Office, showing that the Commissioners appointed by the President, under the provisions of the fourth section of the first named act, have reported to him that the said Northern Pacific Railroad and Telegraph Line, and Branch, excepting that portion between Wallula, Washington, and Portland Oregon, declared forfeited by the Act of September 1890 (26 Stat. 496), have been constructed and fully completed and equipped in the manner prescribed by the act relative thereto, and the same accepted; and

WHEREAS, there has been filed in the office of the Secretary of the Interior evidence showing that the Northern Pacific Railway Company is the lawful successor in interest to the Northern Pacific Railroad Company as to all lands within the limits of the grant made to the said Northern Pacific Railroad Company by the act of July 2, 1864 and all subsequent legislation; and

WHEREAS, certain tracts of land have been selected under the acts aforesaid by the duly authorized agent of said Northern Pacific Rail road Company, now Northern Pacific Railway Company, as shown by his original lists, approved by the local land officers and now on file in the General Land Office; and

WHEREAS, said tracts of land lie conterminous to the constructed line of road, between the forty and fifty mile limits, and are particularly described as follows, to-wit: Willamette Meridian Washington.

Township six north of range three east. The lots one and two, the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter, the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter and the northwest quarter of section thirteen; the south half of the northeast quarter and the southeast quarter of section fifteen; the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter, the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter and the northeast quarter of thesoutheast quarter of section twenty three and the Lots one, two and three, the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter, the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter and the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter and the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of section twenty five;



Containing in the aggregate eight thousand nine hundred eighteen and seven hundredths acres:

NOW KNOW YE, that the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and pursuant to said Acts of Congress, HAA GIVEN AND GRANTED and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Northern Pacific Railway Company, successor in interest to the Northern Pacific Railroad Company, its successors and assigns, the tracts of land selected as aforesaid and embraced in the foregoing: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tracts, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Northern Pacific Railway Company, successor as aforesaid, and to its successors and assigns forever.

And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I Woodrow Wilson, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Mand Office to be hereuntoaffixed.
