Notice is hereby given, that George Weeks, of Stevenson, Skamania County, Washington, claims a lien upon a certain lot of fir saw logs, being about 20,000 feet in quantity, which were cut in Skamania County, Washington, and are marked thus: Not marked, and are now lying in the woods on John Hackens place more particularly described as follows, to wit: SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$

C. in said county and state, and said above named claimant also claims a lien upon eleven head of horses branded and described as follows: 1 bay horse branded "L" on right shoulder; 1 bay horse branded "A" on left shoulder; 1 gray horse branded indistinctly; 1 bay horse, no brand; 1 roan horse branded on right shoulder "T"; 1 white mare, 1 grey mare, 1 grey horse, 1 white horse, 1 bay horse, 1 brown horse - brands unknown. All of said horses being in possession of E. C. Stone, as care taker for the Sheriff in Skamania County, Washington. 5 sets of harness; 1 saddle; 1 blacksmith outfit; 4 bbls skid oil; 2 keys, horse shoes; 6 pair spreaders; 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ pairs coupling dogs; 2 blocks; 125 feet cable; 5 cross cut saws, 1 falling saw; 6 wedges; 5 sledges; 18 shovels; 116 feet 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch rope; 1 grind stone; 2 push blocks; 3 pick axes; 10 grub hoes; 1 foot adz; 2 chains; 9 peaveys; 18 axes; 1 box stone; 12 saw handles; 1 pair skidding songs; 100 lbs blacksmith coal; 1 cooking range; furniture and utensils, and all other personal property said company used in the operation of its business in said county and state. All of said property situated in said company's logging camp near Stevenson, Washington, also on franchise, earnings contracts and the logging road used in the operation of its business, also upon all real estate owned by said company in said county and

state, said real estate being the north half of the D. L. C. of Henry Shepard and wife as described in book "F" pages 272 to 276 record of mortgages of said county and state, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in manufacturing said logs and the construction of said logging plant of said company; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is the said J. A. Russell, B. J. Russell, W. J. Smith and J. H. Parleus, doing business under the firm name of Russell, Smith & Co.; that Robert Clancy, foreman and agent of said Russell, Smith & Co. employed said George Weeks to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to wit: as boss-skidder in manufacturing securing and obtaining said saw logs and in building skid road for said company; that said Russell, Smith & Co., by their foreman and agent, Robert Clancy, agreed to pay the said George Weeks \$2⁵⁰ per day prior to May 1, 1899, and \$2⁷⁵ per day subsequent to May 1, 1899 for all labor performed for such labor and assistance as hereinbefore set forth; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said George Weeks who performed labor upon and assisted in manufacturing said saw logs and in building and operating said log way and logging plant for the period of 54^{1/2}; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said logs and upon said logging plant between the 1st day of April 1899, and the 15 day of July, 1899, and the rendition of said services was closed on the 15 day of July, 1899 and 30 days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said services is \$151⁸⁴ dollars; that no part thereof has been paid, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets the sum of \$151⁸⁴ dollars, in which amount he claims a lien upon said logs and upon said personal property and said real property hereinbefore described; that said George Weeks also claims a lien on all said logs, franchises, earnings, contracts, logging road and all personal property and upon all real property now owned by said J. A. Russell, B. J. Russell, W. J. Smith and J. H. Parleus as partners under the firm name of Russell, Smith & Co. in said Skamania County, Washington, to secure payment for the work and labor performed as herein described.
