Railroads.

Cascade Portage Railroad, in Washington Territory: 6 miles of road bed and track with sidings, turn tables, tanks, inclines, car shops and blacksmith shop complete, and all track material, and tools for track and bridge repairs, 3 locomotives, 3 passenger cars, 35 box cars, 10 flats, 2 hand cars, 1 rubber car.

Oregon Portage Railroad: 5 miles grading and trestle complete with 1 incline 7 miles telegraph line, 236 tons, 30 lb steel rails, 1,850 splice bars, 174 kegs spikes, 1 flat car, 1 hand car, lot wheel-harrows, picks, shovels and drills, and other grading tools.

Dalles and Celilo Railroad: 14½ miles of road bed and track and sidings complete, 2 inclines, freight house, Celilo turn tables, and track tools for repairs of road, 3 locomotives, 27 box cars, 19 platform cars, 2 hand cars, 2 Crank cars, 2 working cars, 2 passenger cars.

Six-sevenths of the Walla Walla and Columbia River Railroad, including new steel rails for road, and material for extension, 250 mile telegraph line from Portland to Walla Walla and telegraph instruments, tables and furniture.
