To all to whom these presents shall come, Greetings:

Whereas, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress of May 20, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Arthur G. Holmes has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the Lot ten, the north half of the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter, the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter, the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter and the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Section two Township four north of Range nine east of the Willamette Meridian, Washington, containing ninety acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the Said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor-General.

NOW KNOW YE, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said claimant the tract of land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said claimant and to the heirs and assigns of the said claimant forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agriculture, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

WHEREAS, F.A. Hyde, being the owner of a tract of land situated and included within the limits of a public forest reservation, known and officially designated as the Olympic Forest Reserve, in Washington, has, under the provisions of the act approved June, 4, 1897, entitled "An act making appropriations for sundry civil expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and ninety-eight, and for other purposes," reconveyed and relinquished the said tract to the United States and has, under the provisions of said act, selected in lieu thereof the following described tract of vacant public land now open to settlement, to-wit:

The west half of the northwest quarter and the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section twenty-three in Township eight north of Range six east of the Willamette Meridian, Washington, containing one hundred acres:

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said F.A. Hyde and to his heirs, the land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said F.A. Hyde and to his heirs, ~~the land above described;~~ and assigns forever. And there is reserved, from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by authority of the United States.
