THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting;

WHEREAS, A Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington, has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress of May 20, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Warren Hollenberry has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the "est half of the west half of the northwest quarter and the west half of the east half of ^{the west half of} the northwest quarter of Section fourteen in Township four north of Range seven east of the Willamette Meridian, Washington, containing sixty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

NOW KNOW YE, That there, is therefore granted by the United States unto the said claimant the tract of land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof unto the said claimant and to the heirs and assigns ^{of said claimant} forever; subject to any vested and accured water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and descisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.
