Notice of Lien

John W. Dickenson, Claimant

C. Wilson, Casper Gropper and

Reputed owners.

Notice is hereby given that John W. Dickenson personally and as assignee of the parties hereinafter named, claims a lien on the franchise, plant, earnings and all the real and personal property of Wilson, Gropper & Co, the same being a Company or private Co-partnership engaged in getting out saw-logs and in operating a steam saw-mill and planing machine and in operating a flume or water-way by means of which the lumber manufactured is transported to the Columbia River for market, in Stannan County, State of Washington; the said firm being composed of C. Wilson, Casper Gropper and P. J. Pannon, who are engaged in conducting said business and of operating said saw mill, machinery flume, etc, under the firm name and style of "Wilson Gropper & Co"

That the said property, of said Company upon which claimant hereby claims a lien is described as follows:

One saw mill complete, situated on the bank of "Rock Creek" from  $1\frac{1}{2}$  to 2 miles from the mouth of said creek on the lands of Gropper - situated on the North East quarter of Section 35 T<sup>2</sup>. 3, - North of Range 7 East of the Willamette Meridian. Said mill including one stationary boiler branded as made by "Smith & Watson" of Portland, Oregon, which boiler is 16 ft. long and 56 inches in diameter and has 89 three inch tubes with a dome 7 ft., long by 30 inches in diameter; one Engine 14 x 18 in; Two 52 in Simon Saw, of Circular make; one 4 saw Co. sager; one Josiah Ross planer; one 40 in. cut-off saw; one 30 in. immer saw; 3 screw-head blocks; one endless chain log runner; 1 cant gear; 1 slab conveyor; 2 saw-dust conveyors; one Blacksmith shop; Grind stone; 1 gear or cogwheel 60 in in diameter; one Drum 20 in diameter and



16 inches long; an outfit for "hammering" saws; and all the belts, belting, pulleys, shafting, gearing and bearings of every nature and also all the tools fixtures and implements used in connection with said mill. All the lumber on the yard at said mill, being about 12,000 feet; all the logs in the boom or pond of said mill, being about 250 logs or about 150,000 feet of logs, board-measure about 86,000 feet of fir lumber on a scow, on the Columbia River known as the "Pholey" scow; said scow now laying near Nelson creek; also the flume leading from said mill to the Columbia River; and the dams used in connection with said mill and also that used with said flume; also the skid roads and ways for hauling in logs from the timber to said mill and also the rights of said company to purchase timber near and about said mill and all the rights, franchises and property, connected with said mill, flume and saw mill and lumber business; all the manufactured or sawed ties in the said Rock Creek all situated in Skamania County, Washington.

That the work hereinafter particularly set out was performed in building and constructing said mill, flume, dams, roadways and in operating said mill and manufacturing said lumber between the dates particularly set out with the name of each individual hereafter and said work was done at the request of C. Wilson, who was in charge of said work.

That the labor so performed was of the value hereafter set in connection with the name of each man and persons, for which several sums and amounts the undersigned claims a lien upon the property herein before described for the several sums hereafter particularly named; amounting in total to \$3237.<sup>25</sup>

The names of the parties performing the work, the time when each began and quit work; the amount due therefor are as follows:

John W. Dickinson (myself) Began March 29<sup>th</sup> 1899, quit Oct 5<sup>th</sup> 1899, total number of days 181<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> at \$2.<sup>50</sup> per day, = \$453.<sup>50</sup>

Louis J. Innari of whose account I am assignee began work Jan 24<sup>th</sup> 1899 quit work Sept 30<sup>th</sup> 1899, balance



due above all credits = \$ 48.57

Hiram Rawlins, of whose account I am assignee Began work Sept 1<sup>st</sup> 1899, quit work Oct 5<sup>th</sup> 1899 total number of days 25 $\frac{3}{4}$  at \$2<sup>25</sup> per day \$57.00

Louis A. Donnelland, of whose account I am assignee Began April 26<sup>th</sup> 1899, quit Oct 4<sup>th</sup> 1899 = 127 days @ \$2<sup>00</sup> Total amount \$ 254. Less amount paid \$ 53.25. Bal. = \$ 110.65

B. Wilson, of whose account I am assignee Began work Dec 1898 quit October 5<sup>th</sup> 1899 Balance due above payments and all offsets = 339.10

John Wilson, of whose claim I am assignee Began work Dec 1898, quit work Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> 1899 Balance due above all offsets and counter claims and payments = 136.47.

Frank Wilson, of whose demand I am assignee Began work Aug 1899, quit Sept 30<sup>th</sup> 1899, Total number of days, 24 $\frac{3}{4}$  at \$177 (nothing paid) 43.31

Jarred Wilson, of whose demand I am assignee Began work, Aug 1899, quit Sept 30<sup>th</sup> 1899 Total days 30 $\frac{1}{2}$  at \$2<sup>00</sup> = \$61.00 Less \$7.50 paid, Balance = 53.50

Ed. Strelbel, of whose demand I am assignee, Began work Aug 1899, quit Oct 4<sup>th</sup> 1899 Total amount due above all payments, etc = 68.00

J. W. Wilson, of whose demand I am assignee work began, Feb 23<sup>rd</sup> 1899 quit Oct 5<sup>th</sup> 1899 Balance due thereon above all credits = 298.43

Columbus C. Fields of whose account I am assignee Began work May 1899 quit work Oct 5<sup>th</sup> 1899 Balance due = 66.97

Mrs Annie Wilson, Cook in the camp of said company in and for the mill aforesaid of whose account I am assignee, Began work April 1899, quit for company Oct 6<sup>th</sup> 1899 Balance due over and above all claims and payments and offsets and counter claims 683.25

Scott Ray, of whose account I am assignee Began work June 25<sup>th</sup> 1899 quit work Oct 5<sup>th</sup> 1899. Total amount of work \$129.75 Less \$62.97 paid. Balance due, 66.78

F. Kautz, of whose account I am assignee Began work May 8<sup>th</sup> 1899 with team of three horses and self, and quit work Oct 4<sup>th</sup> 1899 Total amount of wages due \$485.21



Less total amount paid thereon \$43.00 Balance due above all credits 442.11

That all the foregoing claims are the correct amount due for work done in said camp and about said mill flume and logging therefor and in cooking and running the mess-house, therefor after deducting all just credits and offsets and altogether make the total amount of my lien to be \$3188.64 and \$48.64 making \$3237.25

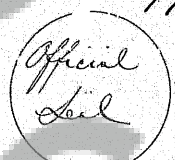
