Notice is hereby given that Christian Alvick claims a lien upon the franchise, earnings and all the real and personal prop'y of Wilson, Cropper & Co. the same being a Company engaged in the operation of a saw-milling, lumber and timber business in Skamania County, State of Washington, said company being composed of E. Wilson, Casper Cropper and P. J. Bannon, who are engaged in conducting said business, and in the operation of the said saw-milling, lumber and timber business under the firm name and style of Wilson, Cropper & Co.

That the said property of the said company upon which this claimant claims a lien is as follows, to-wit:-

Upon a certain wooden building by feet in size,
situated upon the north east quarter of section 35, Township 3,
north of range 7. East of the Willamette Meridian, in Skamania
County, State of Washington, used as a saw-mill building
by the said company.

Also upon the steam boiler and engine, saw-mill machinery, pulleys, belting, shafts, saws, chains, tools, and any and all machinery or tools connected with or in any manner used in and about the said saw-mill building so situated as aforesaid.

Also upon one wooden flume, running from a connection with a certain ditch leading from said mill at a point in section 1 township 2 North Range 7 E. W. in said County, to the Columbia River:- Together with the franchise upon which the said flume is constructed and operated.

This lien is claimed for labor performed by the claimant for the said Company in the operation of said saw-milling, lumber and timber business in Skamania County, State of Washington upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:-

That the claimant was employed by her for said labor

and to render said services for the said company by E. Nilson who was at the date of the employment of this claimant to perform said labor and to render said services, one of the members of said co-partnership.

That said company by E. Nilson, one of the members of said company and manager thereof agreed to pay said Christian Alvik, the sum of \$2⁰⁰ Dollars per day for Eleven days in building flume and barker and loading scow swamping around mill; and the sum of \$2²⁵ per day for three days for barking logs and work around donkey engine.

That claimant commenced to perform said services on the 29th day of Aug., 1899, and ceased the performance thereof on the 2^d day of Sept. 1899, the last services being performed by him for said company the last date mentioned herein, performing between said dates 14 days labor for said company, under the terms and conditions as herein before stated.

That there became due the claimant for the performance of said services, in accordance with the terms of said contract, the sum of \$28⁷⁵. That there has been paid thereon the sum of \$12⁷⁵ and no more. That there is now due the claimant, after deducting all just credits and offsets from the said company, the sum of \$16⁰⁰, in which sum claimant claims a lien upon the property of the said company hereinbefore fully described.

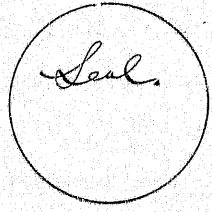
