Certificate No.2312 WHEREAS William Bennett of Klickitat County Washington Territory has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver Washington Territory whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said William Bennett according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the southeast quarter of section eighteen in township three north of range ten east of Willamette Meridian in Washington Territory containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said William Bennett.

"NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said William Bennett and to his heirs, the said Tract above described; To have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said William Bennett and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoir used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprieter of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF I, Grover Cleveland President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
