Power of attorney to locate and sell  
Know all men by these presents that I the undersigned Arnt  
Wold of Tacoma in the State of Washington a citizen of the United  
States have made constituted and appointed, and do hereby  
make, constitute and appoint Karl Rudloff of Toledo in the  
State of Washington, my true and lawful attorney, for me and  
in my name to locate stake and record lode claims, placer  
mining groups and water right in the County of Kanawha  
and State of Washington and to bargain, sell, grant, release  
and convey the same (entire or in separate parcels), and  
also any other lode mining claims, placer mining grounds  
and mining properties, or interests in such claims and  
properties, which have been located in said County of Kanawha  
for me and in my name by W. M. O'Ginner or Karl Rudloff  
as my attorney-in-fact or have been acquired by me by  
purchase from Paul S. Kinch and which are now owned  
by me and to make, seal, acknowledge and deliver any  
and all proper deeds of the same to such person as my  
said attorney may desire, but the said Karl Rudloff shall  
have no right to mortgage any of said claims belonging to me  
the said Arnt Wold hereby ratifying and confirming all  
lawful acts done by my said attorney in virtue hereof
