On July 25, 1974 our firm was retained by Mr. Don Cochran to survey the south boundary of the S.W. 1/4 of the S.E. 1/4 of Section 22, T. 3 N., R. 18 E., W.

Prior to beginning the survey, we obtained copies of section corner reference material from the Skamania County Engineer's Office. With the aid of this information a search was conducted to recover those monuments necessary to survey Mr. Cochran's tract. The S.W. corner of Section 22 is referenced by a Corps of Engineer's brass cap monument set along the west bank of Wind River. This monument gives a tie of 56.1 ft. east to the section corner that falls in the river. No trace of the S.1/4 corner, its bearing trees, or any reference was found recorded or in the field. Its position is assumed lost at this point. The S.E. corner of Section 22 areference poster set on a fence post 66 ft. to the east. This pipe appears to be the same corner tied by BPA during the course of their route survey for the Bonneville-Coulee power line. No bearing trees are left due to logging and clearing the land around. Its position is assumed to be correct judging from the BPA ties and Dept. of Natural Resources reference posters. mation

A traverse was run between the S.E. and S.W. corners of Section 22. The line was then calculated to its true position and south line of Mr. Cochran's tract set. The S. 1/4 corner was set midway and monumented with a l" iron pipe. Two new bearing trees were blazed in reference to the corner. A 14" fir bears N. 2° E. 28.5 ft. and a 9" fir bears S. 5° W., 5.5 ft. This corner is 17 ft. south of an existing fence line. The S.E. corner of Mr. Cochran's tract was set midway between the S. 1/4 and the S.E. corner of Section 22. A 5/8" iron rod was set and two bearing trees set in reference to it. An 8" maple with a blazed face bears S. 89° W., 31.5 ft. A 4" fir with a blazed "X" bears S. 16° E., 14.2 ft. There are no fences in this area or other evidences of ownership.

Corner found and established in the course of the above survey, together with measured bearings, distances and ties are shown on the attached map, T.E.C. work order #5096, which by reference is made a part hereof.


