Dear Brad,

Your September 14, 1994, letter was opened sometime around noon on Friday, September 16, 1994, by my wife. I was unable to read it until Saturday, September 17, 1994, as I did not return to Vancouver until then.

My letter of resignation clearly provides you with nearly two months' written notice of my effective date of resigning from the Skamania County Prosecutor's Office. It also clearly states that I am currently taking long past due vacation.

I consider your letter refusing to pay me while I am on vacation, demanding I return to work while on vacation, accusing me of abandoning the office without adequate notice, and refusing to accept my resignation as an employee in "good standing" as campaign tactics in your capacity as Skamania County Prosecutor which are meant to discredit me, and therefore legally actionable. If I do not receive my regular paycheck on September 30, 1994, and October 31, 1994, and on my final day of employment in November, 1994, I shall take all legal action provided under state and federal law.

Further, if you have been unable to talk to me by phone, as stated in your letter, it is because you have made no attempt. My wife advised you on Wednesday, September 14, 1994, to feel free to call me at the number in the office records which has been successful in contacting me for the last 20 years and which you have previously used. You made no such attempt.

At no time have I made myself unavailable to you for any discussions and/or consultations. I have been around the Courthouse both Thursday, September 15, and Friday, September 16, and I was present at candidates' meetings at which you were present both of those evenings.


Finally, you have clearly provided in a memorandum recently circulated within the office for accumulation of "comp" time by me for after hours work.

I was of the opinion that since you have taken several days away from the office to campaign, that you would have no objection to my doing the same. However, if you are dissatisfied with my taking the "comp" time from Wednesday, September 14, 1994 through Tuesday, September 20, please contact me so that we may make mutually acceptable arrangements for those days at the appropriate time after the completion of my vacation. The days between September 14, 1994, and September 20, 1994, may then be

considered my vacation.

I will continue to be available in Shamania County at any time you should wish to meet with me, and you may also leave messages for me at the number in your office records.
