UPEN SPACE TAXATION AGREEMENT 121936 CH. 84.34 RCW (TO BE USED FOR "OPEN SPACE", "TIMBER LAND" CLASSIFICATION OR "RECLASSIFICATION" ONLY) This Agreement between _ .. Len Lanham <u>Skamania</u> County hereinafter called the "Owner", and ... hereinafter called the "Granting Authority". Whereas the owner of the following described real property having made application for classification of that property under the provisions of CH. 84.34 RCW. 02-06-28-00-0902 Assessor's Parcel or Account Numbers: Legal Description of Classified Land: _ Lot 3, Jackson Short Plat, Book 3, Page 80

And whereas, both the owner and granting authority agree to limit the use of said property, recognizing that such land has substantial public value as open space and that the preservation of such land constitutes an important physical, social, esthetic, and economic asset to the public, and both parties agree that the classification of the property during the life of this Agreement shall be for:

OPEN SPACE LAND

TIMBER LAND

Now, therefore, the parties, in consideration of the mutual convenants and conditions set forth herein, do agree as follows:

- 1. During the term of this Agreement, the land shall be used only in accordance with the preservation of its classified use.
- 2. No structures shall be erected upon such land except those directly related to, and compatible with, the classified use of the land.
- 3. This Agreement shall be effective commencing on the date the legislative body receives the signed Agreement from the property owner, and shall remain in effect for a period of at least ten (10) years.
- 4. This Agreement shall apply to the parcels of 'and described herein and shall be binding upon the heirs, successors and assignces of the parties hereto.
- 5. Withdrawal: The land owner may withdraw from this Agreement if, after a period of eight years, he or she files a request to withdraw classification with the assessor. Two years from the date of that request the assessor shall withdraw classification from the land, and the applicable taxes and interest shall be imposed as provided in RCW 84.34.070 and 84.34.108.
- 6. Breach: After the effective date of this Agreement, any change in use of the land, except through compliance with items (5), (7) or (9) shall be considered a breach of this Agreement, and shall be subject to removal of classification and liable for applicable taxes, possible, and interest as provided in RCW 84.34.080 and 84.34.08.
- A breach of Agreement shall not have occurred and the additional tax shall not be imposed if removal of classification resulted solely from:
 - (a) Transfer to a governmental entity in exchange for other land located within the State of Washington.
 - (b) A taking through the exercise of the power of eminent domain, or sale or transfer to an entity having such power in anticipation of the exercise of such power and having manifest its intent in writing or by other official action.
 - (c) A natural disaster such as a flood, windstorm, earthquake, or other such calamity rather than by virtue of the act of the landowner changing the use of such property.
 - (d) Official action by an agency of the State of Washington or by the county or city where the land is located disallowing the present use of such land.
 - (e) Transfer of land to a church when such land would qualify for exemption pursuant to RCW 84.36.020.
 - (f) Acquisition of property interests by State agencies or agencies or organizations qualified under RCW 84.34.210 and 64.04.130 (See RCW 84.34.108 (5)(f)).
 - (g) Removal of land classified as farm and agricultural land under RCW 84.34.020(2)(d).
- 8. The county assessor may require an owner to submit data relevant to continuing the eligibility of any parcel of land described in this Agreement.
- 9. Reclassification as provided in Chapter 84.34. RCW. FORM REV 64 0022-1 (2-93)

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This Agreement shall be subject to the following conditions:

- 1. All harvested areas, except a 1-acre home site and the 1 acre open area adjacent to the home site shall be restocked to 12 by 12 foot spacing with douglas-fir seedling or other type of tree species within 3 years of harvest or contain at least 100 trees/acre of at least 20 year old trees.
- All newly planted areas that contain brush shall be slashed on a yearly basis in order to allow the conifers to out-compete the brush. This shall continue until the trees reach 6' in height.
- 3. All timber management shall be as specified in the Forest Management Plan, dated November 29, 1994, that was prepared by Thomas Swarts.

It is declared that this Agreement specifies the classification and conditions as provided for in CH. 84.34 RCW and the conditions imposed by this Granting Authority.
