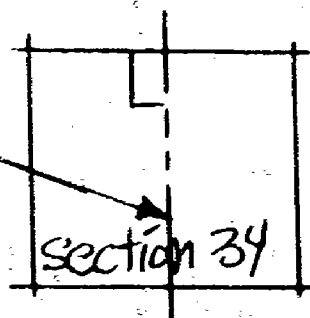

The point of discovery whereon this notice is posted is situated approximately 2640 feet in a westernly direction from the northeast corner of section 34, of Township 10 North, in Range 8 East of Skamania County in the State of Washington

and from thence the boundaries of said claim are marked and described as follows:

Commencing at a post marked Nr. 1, at the point of discovery, thence approximately 660 feet in a westernly direction to the north west corner post marked Nr. 2 which is in the creek and is witnessed from the east line, thence approximately 1320 feet in a southernly direction to the southwest corner post marked Nr. 3, which is also in the creek and witnessed from the east line, thence approximately 660 feet in an easternly direction to the southeast post marked Nr. 4 and is witnessed from the east line, thence northernly approximately 1320 feet to the northeast corner post marked Nr. 1 at the point of discovery, comprising of 20 acres in the said section 34, of Township 10 North, in Range 8 East of Skamania County in the State of Washington for the purpose of placer mining within the high water line of McCoy Creek as granted by existing laws and hydraulic project approval.

Notice of location must be recorded within thirty days from the date of discovery at the office of the auditor of the county in which such discovery was made. Twenty Acres may be included in one placer claim and if located on surveyed land it must be according to legal subdivisions.

Care must be taken to fully describe the claim with reference to natural objects and permanent monuments or survey description, so that the boundaries can be readily traced. The blank spaces in this form must be carefully and properly filled out.

The discoverer must perform labor upon such location in developing the same to an amount which shall be equivalent in the aggregate to at least \$10.00 worth of such labor for each twenty acres, or fractional part thereof, contained in such location or claim, within sixty days from the date of discovery, and upon performance of such labor, file with the auditor of county an affidavit showing such performance and generally the nature and kind of work so done. Provided however, that certain federal regulations may apply, in addition or in place of the above.
