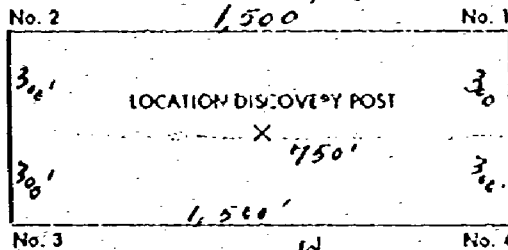

NOTICE HEREBY IS GIVEN that the undersigned locators, each a citizen of the United States or one who has declared an intention to become such, have discovered a vein or lode of locatable mineral-bearing rock in place upon the public domain of the United States which is open to mineral entry and location within the above state, county and mining district; and, in accordance with the laws of the United States and of the State of Oregon, have located and do hereby locate a claim upon such vein or lode by posting this notice of such discovery and location on a substantial post or monument at the point of discovery. 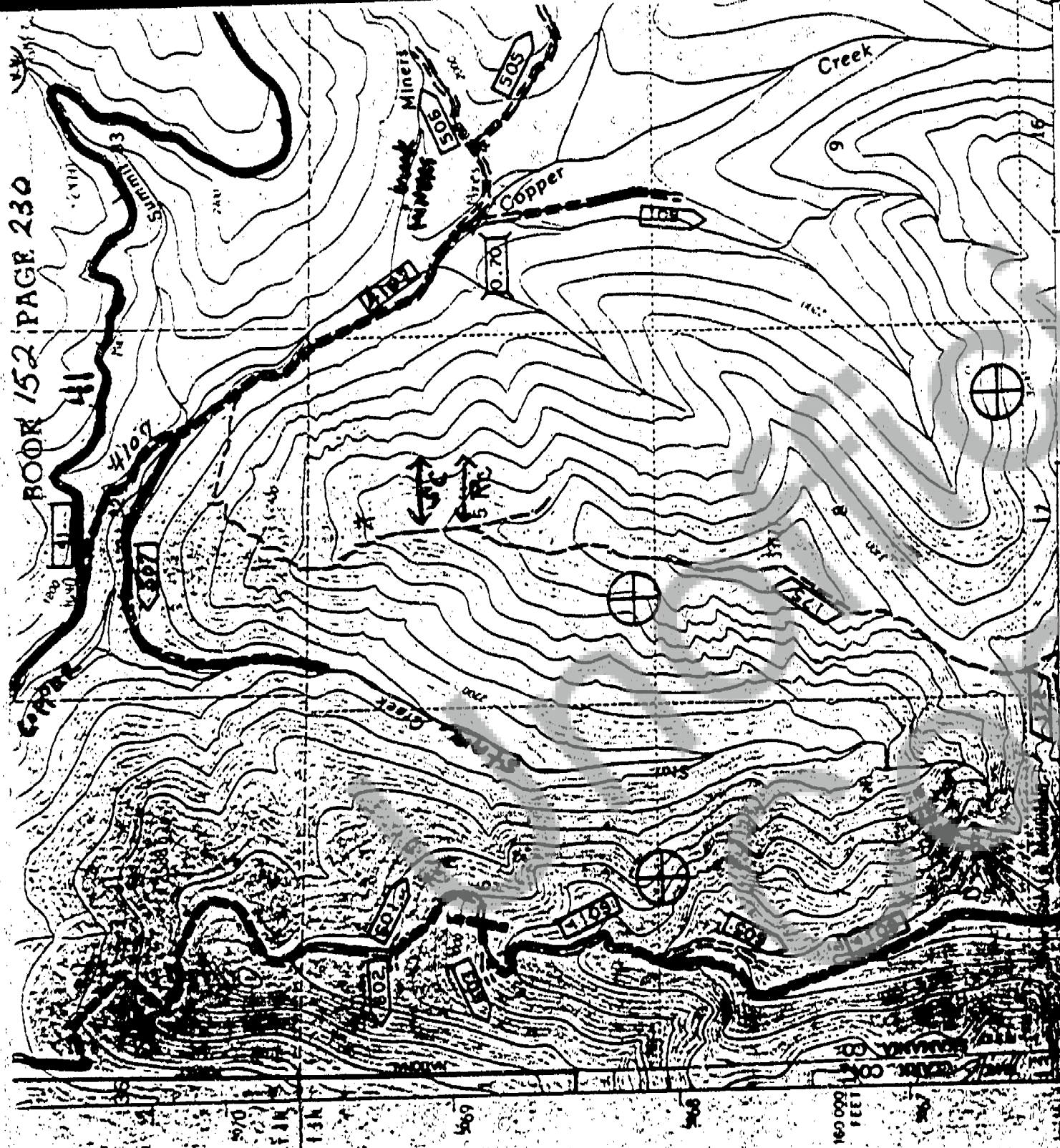
