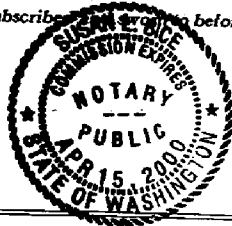

* Federal law requires that not less than \$100 worth of labor must be performed or improvements made on a mining claim annually to hold the possessory right to the claim. The period within which the work is required to be done commences at 12:00 a clock Meridian on the first day of September succeeding the date of location of the claim. The applicable state law should be examined to determine all requirements for an Affidavit of Proof of Labor or Improvements and the time allowed for filing affidavits since requirements and time vary from state to state.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: A mining claim is deemed abandoned under 30 U.S. Code Sec. 1744 unless a copy of the official record of an affidavit of assessment work performed, a notice of intention to hold a mining claim, or a detailed report under 30 U.S. Code Sec. 28.1 is also filed annually for recordation with the state office of the Bureau of Land Management in the state where the claim is situated on or before December 30th of each year following the calendar year in which the claim was located. Because BLM recordation regulations change periodically, you should obtain recordation regulations from your local BLM office to determine effective requirements for mining claims. FACILITY USE RESTRICTIONS

- 1.0 Facility users must comply with all applicable State and Federal Laws, City and County ordinances, administrative directives, policies and rental agreement conditions. All measures necessary to insure the safe, healthy and lawful conduct of the activities, including but not limited to crowd control measures and fire and police protection shall be undertaken and financed as outlined in the rental agreement. Facility users agree to obtain all necessary permits or licenses for the conduct of it's activities.
- 2.0 Use or possession of alcoholic beverages is prohibited except in designated areas as defined by permit.
- 2.1 Illicit drugs are prohibited.
- 3.0 Smoking is prohibited except in designated areas.
- 4.0 Profane or improper language or actions are prohibited and may result in expulsion from the Grounds.
- 5.0 Participants are not to operate or use any county equipment other than that stipulated in the Facility Use Application.
- 6.0 County keys shall not be issued or loaned to non-county personnel except by permission of the Parks and Recreation Director or his/her designee. Doors will be opened by authorized personnel. Keys are not to be loaned to any other person. No copies of keys are to be made.
- 7.0 After use for partisan or religious activities each group or individual shall police the area to ensure that no partisan or religious information, literature, papers or documents of any kind remain in the facility.
- 8.0 Games of chance, lotteries, Amusement Games as defined by state law, are permitted in County Fair Grounds when licensed as provided by law, on County Fair Grounds.
- 9.0 Tables, kitchen equipment or any other county furniture or equipment shall not be removed from buildings to which they belong except by authorization from Parks and Recreation Director.
- 10.0 Gym shoes, with non-marking soles, shall be required for indoor activity-type games such as basketball, volleyball, etc.
- 11.0 Prior approval from the Parks and Recreation Director will be required before decorations or other materials may be applied to walls or floors. Applicants are required to remove, at their expense, decorations, materials equipment, furnishings and rubbish left after use of the facilities.
