LOCATION:

Milepost 8.73 to 8.32 along Cook-Underwood Road, with new equipment site off Cook-Underwood Road at Milepost 8.69 on Highland Orchards Road, Section 24 of T3N, Range 9E, W.M. and identified as Skamania County Tax Lot #3-9-

LEGAL:

Milepost 8.73 to 8.32 along Cook-Underwood Road

ZONING:

General Management Area - Large Scale Agriculture (AG-1)

DECISION:

Based upon the Staff Report, the application by Dyrk Pritchett of Sprint-United Telephone, described above, subject to the conditions set forth in this Decision, is found to be consistent with Title 22 SCC and is hereby approved.

Approval of this request does not exempt the applicant or successors in interest from compliance with all other applicable local, state, and federal laws.

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CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

The following conditions are required to ensure that the subject request is consistent with Skamania County Title 22. This document, outlining the conditions of approval, must be recorded in the deed records of the Skamania County Auditor in order to ensure notice of the conditions of approval to successors in interest. SCC §22.06.050(CX2).

- All developments shall be consistent with the enclosed site plan, unless modified by the following conditions of approval. If modified, the site plan shall be consistent with the conditions of approval.
- 2) The three utility boxes on the gravel pad shall be painted/stained with a non-reflective or low-reflective, low-gloss dark natural or earth-tone color. The applicant shall submit the exterior color samples to the Planning Department prior to issuance of a utility permit.
- All vegetation shall be retained except that which is necessary for site development.
- 4) All disturbed areas shall be re-seeded with native vegetation upon completion of the project.
- Screening plantings shall be installed as follows: four planting installations beginning as close to Highland Orchard Road as permitted continuing to the NE comer of the equipment site, three planting installations along the backside (east side) of the equipment site, and four planting installations beginning at the SE corner of the equipment site reaching out as close to Highland Orchard Road as permitted. Planting installations shall be 50% native, all coniferous, planted at least 5 feet tall (not including root wad), within 2 feet of the equipment and parking site, on approximately 2-3 foot centers. Plantings shall be installed prior to final inspection by the Planning Department. See staff additions on site plan for planting requirements. See the Native Plants list attached to the Staff Report for planting species. A landscaping plan shall be submitted to the Planning Department for approval, prior to issuance of a utility permit.
- 6) The applicant and future owners shall be responsible for the proper maintenance and survival of all vegetation required under this Decision. Dead and dying vegetation shall be replaced with the same species in approximately the same location.
- 7) The applicant shall call the Planning Department for a final inspection upon project completion.
- 8) The following procedures shall be effected when cultural resources are discovered during construction activities:
 - a) Halt Construction. All construction activities within 100 feet of the discovered cultural resource shall cease. The cultural resources shall remain as found; further disturbance is prohibited.
 - b) Notification. The project applicant shall notify the Planning Department and the Gorge Commission within 24 hours of the discovery. If the cultural resources are prehistoric or

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otherwise associated with Native Americans, the project applicant shall also notify the Indian tribal governments within 24 hours.

c) Survey and Evaluations. The Gorge Commission shall arrange for the cultural resources survey.

NOTES

Any new residential development, related accessory structures such as garages or workshops, and additions or alterations not included in this approved site plan, will require a new application and review.

As per SCC §22.06.050(C)(2), this Administrative Decision SHALL BE RECORDED in the County deed records prior to commencement of the approved project.

As per SCC §22.06.050(C)(5), this Administrative Decision approving a proposed development action shall become void in two years if the development is not commenced within that period, or when the development action is discontinued for any reason for one continuous year or more.

APPEALS


