DECISION:

Based upon the Staff Report, the application by Skamania County, described above, subject to the conditions set forth in this Decision, is found to be consistent with Title 22 SCC and is hereby approved.

Although the proposed development is approved, it may not be buildable due to inadequate soils for septic and/or lack of potable water. These issues are under the jurisdiction of Skamania County's Building Department and the Washington State Health District.

Approval of this request does not exempt the applicant or successors in interest from compliance with all other applicable local, state, and federal laws.

## CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

The following conditions are required to ensure that the subject request is consistent with Skamania County Title 22. This document, outlining the conditions of approval, must be recorded in the deed records of the Skamania County Auditor in order to ensure notice of the conditions of approval to successors in interest. SCC §22.06.050(C)(2).

- All developments shall be consistent with the enclosed site plan, unless modified by the following conditions of approval. If modified, the site plan shall be consistent with the conditions of approval.
- Those areas of existing roadway that will be abandoned due to the realignment of Duncan Creek Road, and those areas that are newly cut and graded, shall be graded to emulate existing natural contours, and shall be revegetated using native tree species. The trees shall be Western Red Ceder, Douglas Fir and Red Alder, and be planted at a 1:1:1 ratio at a five foot spacing through out the project area. However, trees shall not be planted in areas that would be likely to create a safety hazard. In those areas, native grasses and shrub type vegetation should be planted.
- Existing large conifers, with a DBH greater than 20°, that will be felled should be left on site as coarse woody debris.
- 4) The guardrail shall be constructed of weathering steel.
- 5) Only those trees necessary for site development and safety purposes shall be removed.
- 6) All of the above conditions relating to visual subordinance shall be satisfied prior to completion of this project.
- 7) There shall be no development within the 100 foot buffer of Chavez Creek without a separate rehabilitation plan prepared by a qualified professional.
- The applicant shall submit a grading plan prior beginning work on this project. (see Staff Report for details on what is required in the grading plan)
- 9) The following procedures shall be effected when cultural resources are discovered during construction activities:
  - a) Halt Construction. All construction activities within 100 feet of the discovered cultural resource shall cease. The cultural resources shall remain as found; further disturbance is prohibited.
  - b) Notification. The project applicant shall notify the Planning Department and the Gorge Commission within 24 hours of the discovery. If the cultural resources are prehistoric or otherwise associated with Native Americans, the project applicant shall also notify the Indian tribal governments within 24 hours.

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c) Survey and Evaluations. The Gorge Commission shall arrange for the cultural resources survey.

As per SCC §22.06.050(C)(5), this Decision approving a proposed development action shall become void in two years if the development is not commenced within that period, or when the development action is discontinued for any reason for one continuous year or more.

This Decision shall be final unless reversed or modified on appeal. A written Notice of Appeal may be filed by an interested person within 20 days from the date hereof. Appeal may be made to the Skamania County Board of Adjustment, P.O. Box 790, Stevenson, WA 98648, on or before fully 12,2001. Notice of Appeal forms are available at the Department Office.
